Sheer Size & Variety – With over 8,000 acres across two full mountains, you can ski for days without repeating runs.

Ride the PEAK 2 PEAK Gondola

Scenic lift rides between Whistler and Blackcomb give amazing panoramic views and are a perfect way to be in the mountains without skis.

Dogsledding

Trappers Run & Dogsled Base tours through scenic forests are unforgettable.

Whistler Olympic Park

Cross-country skiing, snowshoeing, ice skating, and other winter activities at a venue from the 2010 Olympics.

Shopping & Village Strolls

Browse boutiques, galleries, cafes, and artisan shops in Whistler Village.

Blackcomb Snowmobile Base

Snowmobile tours let you explore backcountry terrain and wooded areas.

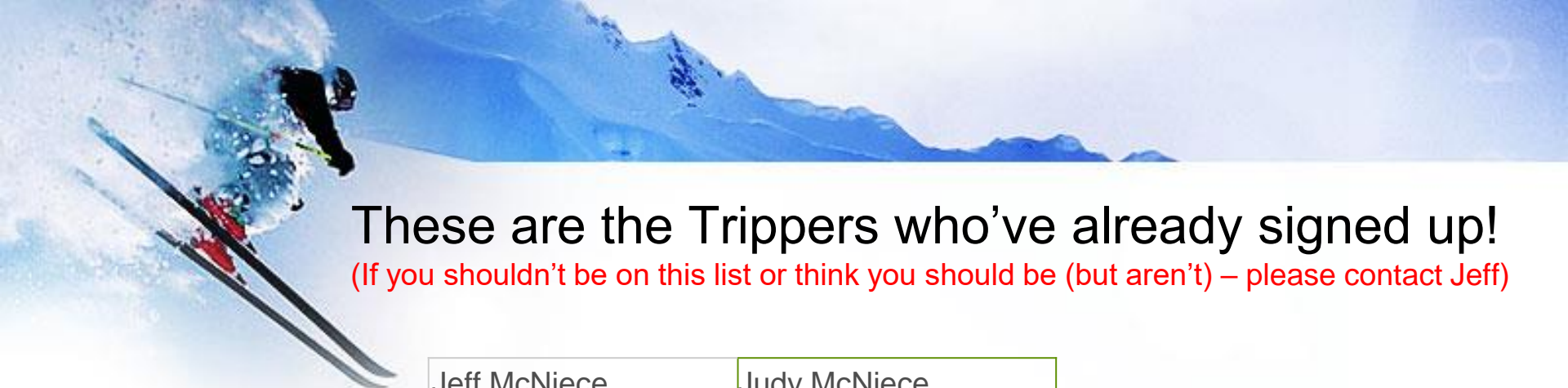

How to Register for a Trip
